Spotlight on the Choristers By Miriam Piikkila

Congratulations to the Choristers for 73 years of continuous singing (even singing outside during Covid) and they are still going strong.

The CRA Choristers started singing in May 1950 with sixteen members who sang every Thursday night at the Agricultural Hall, renamed the CRA Hall, renamed the Lewis Centre. They sang at local venues and care facilities. When the Florence Filberg Centre opened on July 11, 1988, they practiced there. Their dress code was white and black and was later changed to casual. On festive occasions, they dressed for the season.



In fact, the Choristers have sung many times at the Filberg Centre, including birthday parties and in the lounge to entertain. Their 8th Variety Show was held in 2016. Individuals, duos, trios, quartets and the Choristers added to the success of their show. There were over 70 names on the Choristers' roster pre COVID and the numbers are returning.

The Choristers have performed at many venues in the Comox Valley over the years, including 11 Senior Facilities (Yes, that's right!), having a monthly performance at some of them. They have also performed at 2 malls, the Westerly Hotel, the Filberg Lodge and at the Anderton Gardens.

Further afield, they sang in Campbell River, Parksville and Victoria. While in Victoria, 48 Choristers sang to the Lieutenant Governor Steven Point, his wife and staff at the Government House. They also sang in the Rotunda at the Parliament Buildings and at 2 Senior Celebration Festivals at the George Pearkes Recreation Centre. Many wonderful memories were created and they surprised people with their 2 flash mobs, singing on the bus on their travels and at their lunches. It was lots of fun.

In the past and present, many Choristers, directors, pianists, and musicians have shared their musical talents. Loretta Jensen, also their greeter, has assembled song booklets since 2006. Rick Forward selected their songs for over 10 years. Val Parmley has directed the Choristers for 13 years. Mary Ann Tait, their Celtic lass, has been singing in the Valley for 50 years. Their dedication is much appreciated.

The late Ken Macleod Extraordinaire produced single handedly 19 musical shows. His last Remembrance Day Show was in 2018 with the Choristers being an integral part of the show. This November 8th, 2023, the Remembrance Day Show will be dedicated to Ken Macleod and the Choristers will be performing once again.

Singing has many benefits. Music has the capacity to Heal, Comfort and Inspire. The Choristers warmly welcome new members.

You can join them on Friday mornings in the Rotary Hall from 10:30-12:00 pm.
