



On average, 12 of us meet once a week, come rain or shine, or sleet or snow, and we paint, draw and create in a friendly and supportive environment. We are not a teaching group although there is always some helpful advice available, if asked for. We have many talented and knowledgeable artists who are often willing to share their expertise.



We bring our own supplies as we work in many different media, however we do have a storage space that has some 'spares' for when we leave brushes and paper at home. There is also a selection of art books available for inspiration. And a nice thing about having the craft room is that some of our group are not lucky enough to have 'studio/painting' space at home and so this is their opportunity to spread out and create.

We are fortunate in that we can also display our art work in the Evergreen Lounge as that allows us to showcase our work in a public space, and hopefully it is enjoyed.

When entering the foyer of the Filberg Centre you will have noticed a mural of Courtenay, the glacier some daisies and some geese! This mural was created and painted by one of our original members Mariane Arnold. Marian also painted the art work that hangs above the serving area in the lounge. And talking of murals, two of our group, Jane and Peter, were involved in painting another mural, this one is at MARS, the animal rescue centre in Merville.

Another member of our group, Gordon, was involved in painting some of the scenery and props in support of the production of The Corner Store that was put on by The Second Stage Players last year. Longtime member Karen was once very involved with the Pearl Ellis Art Gallery and Judy who joined us more recently from 'back east' has shown in galleries in Owen Sound, Ontario and Buffalo, New York.

Birth of a Board Game

Evergreen Club members Anne Doyle and David Leverton have lived in Courtenay for almost 17 years. Like many other Evergreen Club members, Anne and David arrived from somewhere else, in this case New Zealand. David had been speaking at a local conference and the couple had been dividing their time between New Zealand and Yukon. They fell in love with the Comox Valley region and within months had resettled to Courtenay.

The pair, however, were not ready to retire and continued to follow their chosen career paths. David is a consultant and business executive, and Anne is a visual artist and designer. In the past, they have used their entrepreneurial skills to run several retail business ventures including two art galleries and a retail operation in the cruise ship port of Skagway, Alaska.



After over 40 years of marriage and all the life experiences Anne and David have shared together, they decided to take on a new venture: the creation of a board game they called Dice Hockey[™]. Like so many Canadian youth, David picked up his first hockey stick and laced on his first pair of skates at an early age. During the winter, he was either playing hockey in the local arena, playing out on a frozen pond, or playing on the street in front of his home. Anne never played hockey but was an aspiring artist from an early age who turned her love of art into a lifetime profession. The combination of Anne's artistic talents and David's understanding of the sport of hockey is the impetus behind the creation of the game.

The game is modelled after Canada's national winter sport and the different player formats are designed to be inclusive, cooperative, competitive and most of all, fun to play. The game combines strategic thinking, and skilful planning with the dynamic nature of the laws of probability and the age-old element of luck. It is armchair hockey at its best and includes all the elements you would find in a regular ice hockey game. You get to be the coach, offense, defense, and goaltender on every play. Anyone over 10 years of age who either loves hockey or is interested in learning more about the sport, will enjoy playing this new tabletop game. It is a great game for seniors and can be played year-round at home, at the cottage, in Dice Hockey[™] leagues, or in group tournaments.

Anne and David are looking forward to launching their new game at the Evergreen Club Lounge, on Friday, May 10 at 1:00 p.m. to help support the introduction of the game to Valley residents and as a fundraising event for the Club. The couple will be demonstrating the new game for Evergreen Club members and will be available to answer any questions.
